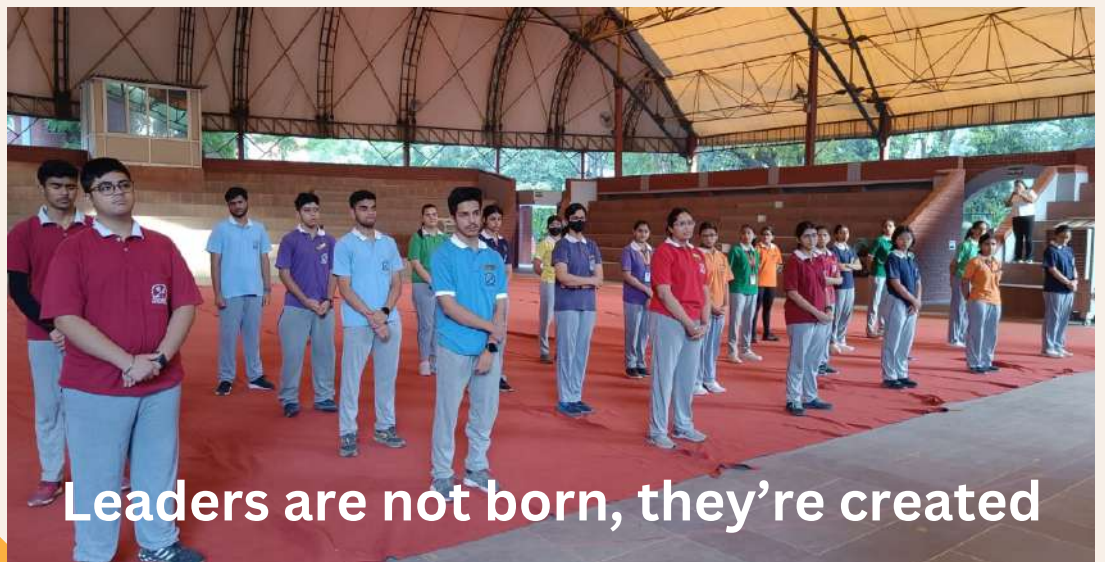


-Inspiring Leaders for Tomorrow

With a fresh mind they moved on to some thrilling adventure activities comprising of Burma Bridge and Commando Net to get their blood pumping.



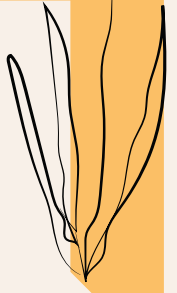

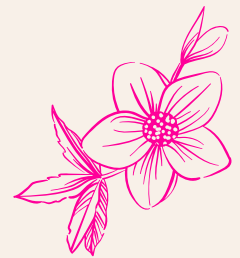
With the very first activity I was excited for the day. Doing a hand stand for the first time was a new experience. Certain life – skill activities proved to be amazing. I'd like to relive the day.

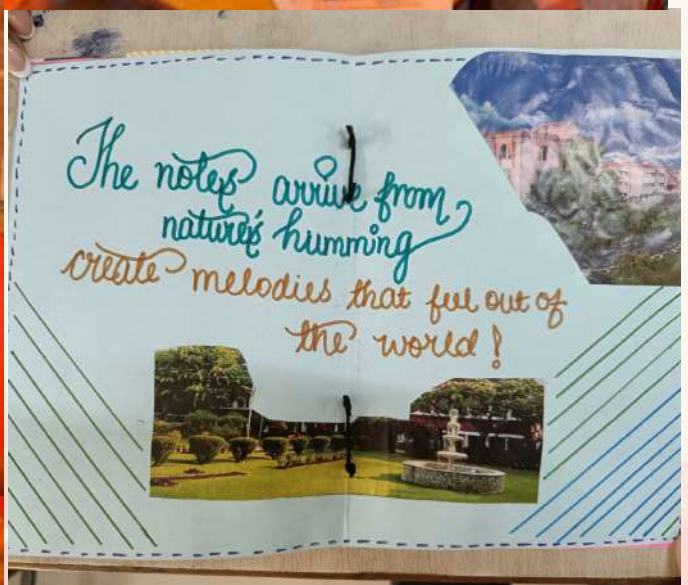
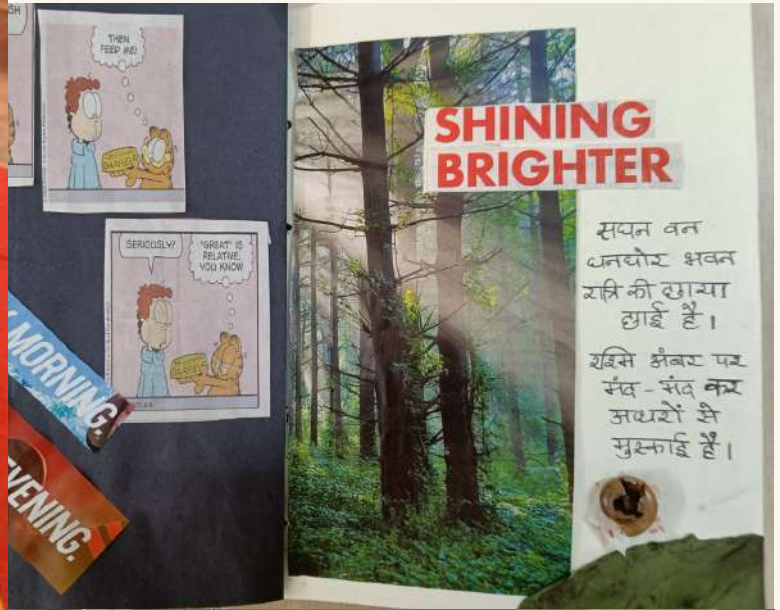
It was a great experience with regard to the activities we got to indulge in – a great learning experience indeed, definitely a day pinned down in my memory for years.

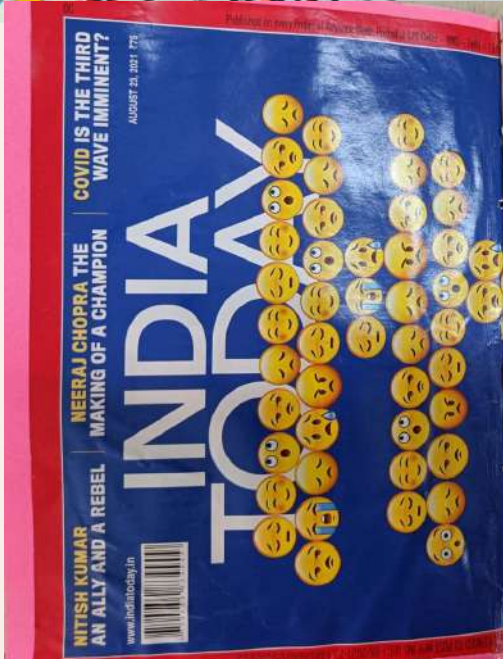
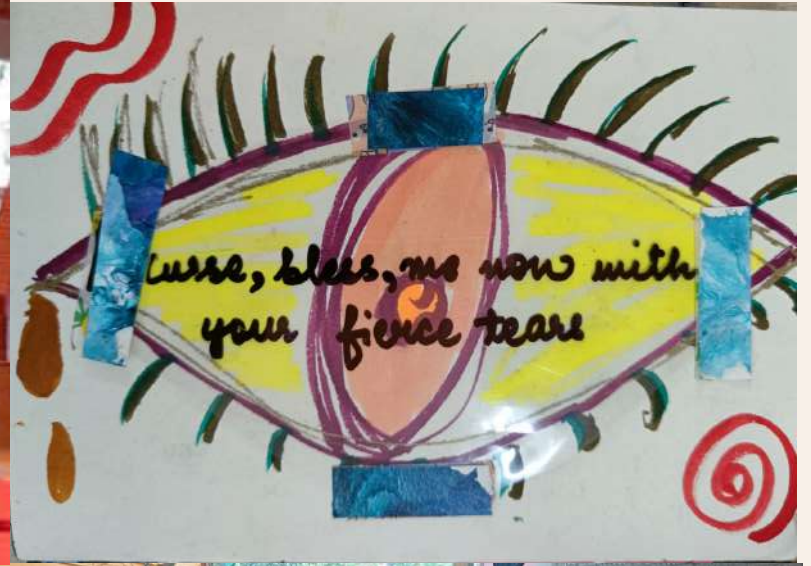
